

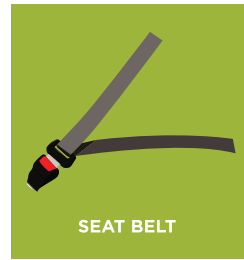
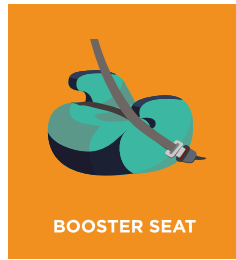

IMPORTANT REMINDERS:

<p>Airbags</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Make sure you are properly seated and remember—airbags are designed to work with seat belts, not replace them. Never put a rear-facing car seat in the front passenger seat in front of a live airbag. Front passenger airbags can injure or kill young children in a crash. The back seat is always safest. Children under 13 should sit in the back seat
<p>Unused Seat Belts</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> It is dangerous if passengers become entangled by pulling a seat belt all the way out of the retractor or by playing with an unused seat belt.
<p>Projectiles</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Secure all items in your vehicle. Unsecured objects can launch out of place when a car comes to a sudden stop or is in a crash.
<p>Unattended Children in or Around Cars</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Prevent backovers. Walk all the way around a parked car to check for children before backing up. Prevent heatstroke. Never leave your child unattended in a vehicle. Prevent trunk entrapment. Always lock all doors and trunk to your vehicle when it is not in use.
